Staff Legislative Activity Report and General Discussion

Staff advised that they continue to work on preparation for WC Reform this legislative session.

Staff is also re-engaging the DIR on efforts to include carve-out claim resolutions in the EAMS reporting process, per prior direction from the committee. The DIR has submitted a

budget proposal for new software to replace the EAMS system, which will hopefully include this reporting piece.

CalOSHA is discussing re-adoption of the COVID-19 Emergency Temporary Standards (ETS), with new amendments, at its Standards Board meeting today.

Legislative Action Plan

At the Fall 2021 Strategic Planning Retreat, direction was given to develop a Legislative Action Plan, focusing on Tort Reform.

The Committee approved the creation of the proposed Legislative Action Plan for Tort Reform presented that includes milestones and focus areas on the following:

- 1) Creation of Coalition
- 2) Distribution to Members
- 3) Education of Local Officials
- 4) Education of Legislators
